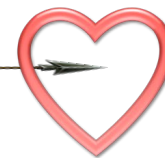

Dear prayer partners + friends

Riverton, July 29th 2019

July 29th equals 65 years of age for Kurt! As of August I will be on *semi-retirement*. This means that we keep doing what we love doing, namely serving God, teaching His Word, evangelizing and discipling hungry souls, red and white. Here in a few words what is changing and what remains the same:

ADMINISTRATION: - Less administration by reducing the publishing of our prayer letters. Thank you for your understanding! - As of January 2019 I had stepped back from coordinating for Prison Fellowship. We are available as a resource for the volunteers and do substitute teaching when necessary at the Sho-Rap treatment facility, the Honor Farm prison and at the VOA Detox.

FINANCES: - For our cherished **US** donors, nothing changes, since your donations fund our field expenses like travel (car and plane) and literature, mainly Bibles for the jail. - In **Switzerland** a big part of our salary is now covered by social security, but we still need some donations to keep living and doing what we know God has called us to do. We also plan to study more of the Hebrew language, if possible during a longer stay in Israel in the "near" future. - For May 2020 ministry in France, to restart a congregation through Open Aairs, and an OAC seminar in Switzerland are planned!

REGULAR MINISTRY: We keep doing the weekly Open Aairs and Bible study at Set Free, the monthly Bible Story hour at the Tribal Children Home, the Bible Study at the Fremont County Group Home (boys) and the short devotions at the Christian Food Store House. Bi-weekly we teach the Bible at the Lander Jail. However in August we shall take a break, visiting our children. **SEASONAL + SPONTANEOUS MINISTRY:** When hiking God allows many opportunities to share with people we meet. The pictures highlight the additional Open Air opportunities we had in July.



The River Walk Event: Once a year musicians, food vendors, games etc. are offered to the pedestrians. We have been invited to paint and share the Bible through Gospel Magic. After watching several programs two Mormons talked to us. In the end they even accepted a Gospel booklet. We praise God for this deep spiritual conversation! Pray for all who were reached!



Left: Library Chalk the Walk Event: In windy Wyoming this is a great opportunity, since the pedestrian walk will not be blown away. Shoshanah painted the priest blowing the Shofar. In our conversations we emphasized that we need to get ready (John 3:16 + Ephesians 5:27) for the return of our Messiah King and Bridegroom. Soon God himself will blow the Shofar announcing the arrival of His Son to start ruling and teaching from Jerusalem.

Right: When cycling we met these two homeless ladies who remembered our Open Aairs and Bible clubs they attended in their youth. They confirmed that they still trust the Savior! One of them was kicked out by her husband. We provided them with food and Bibles. They were so happy! Pray that they will find good homes.
