While we were shut down by the mandatory quarantine, which started right after our last newsletter went out, time was spent organizing files, straightening up and re-organizing our home OAC work area, doing a few honey-do's and trying to maintain sanity. We're sure most of you can relate. As you all well know, it has been an up and down year; it has been that way for the ministry as well.

Beautiful Feet Homeless ministry in Ft. Worth was deemed essential and remained operative but were only allowed to serve their clients a sack lunch outside. They invited us to broadcast via audio to the homeless people as they waited in line to receive their meals and had us do a morning devotional for the staff before preaching to the homeless. This pattern began early in the quarantine on a bi-weekly basis and allowed us to keep just a little bit of our sanity.

As the quarantine was lifting and we were able to go out some, time in prayer was spent at each location where we regularly do ministry. The prayers were asking the Lord to supply people to hear the Gospel, that He would save some and protect those we spoke to and us as well.

The ministry is still up and down and, of course, the people available to talk to are not as numerous, but by God's grace and the lifting of some governmental restrictions, we have been able to reach quite a few people with the Gospel, especially in late June and July. Check out the pics for a sample of the ministry at a few locations. Additionally, just in our personal contacts (when we could legally be out and about over the last few months), we have distributed about 300 gospel tracts and witnessed to three people.
