Dear prayer partners, 08-02-2020 (thul5 2020)

The top picture was taken before July 13, the bottom one after that date. Without clear communication, the owner had the Alamo destroyed. After a long search, involving the Sheriff's department and the county, I was able to talk to the owner. I found out that he was more concerned that he would not be allowed to do so, since this old railway spot could have been a historical landmark, than that people could lose their possessions. At least a deputy was there to make sure no one was sleeping in the bunker... Our friends were up town to get food and a couple of them washed two blankets at the river. When they came back all their belongings were under the earth. This includes the 2 new sleeping bags, 2 Bibles, the Indian Symbols booklet, tarp, rope, saw and flashlight we had given to them. Other folks gave a mattress and pillows. Some heirloom jewelry, the food box, 2 driver's licenses and a birth certificate are also buried. One lady has, for the 2<sup>nd</sup> time in one month, lost everything, except her clothes she had on, and her back-pack. In the recent past she had lost her husband and her job; her car also needs to be fixed. Now she even lost her "homeless home". Happily, she got her job back. Pray that she can get into Eagle's Hope housing and fix her car, since the distance to her job is almost 25 miles, riding the taxi to work (very limited public transport!) is very expensive.



When, on July 14, we met the clan in the City park, they were desperate. Immediately they asked for replacement Bibles, saying that this was the most important possession they had. Jamie opened the Bible "accidentally" to Isaiah 55 where it appropriately proclaims: "All you who are thirsty, come to the water! You without money, come, buy, and eat! Yes, come! Buy wine and milk without money — it's free!" Again, through you, dear prayer partners, God provided - no wine though! We circled up and prayed, thanking God for HIS care. Happily, in summer they can sleep outside, but where will they go in winter? When we had a Ministerial Association, the Detox Center and the Good Samaritan Shelter were started. Now, partially because of funding cuts, due to C-19, those services have, hopefully only temporarily, been cut back or stopped. Pray for M.W. of Eagle's Hope who tries to reopen those services. **Volunteer staff is needed!** (Training and salary available, call 307-463-2020!)



W. Antelope was sitting all by himself at a table. He remembered having participated in a Bible Camp on Casper Mountain when he was young. In 2010 a bullet hit the frame of his glasses. The splinters destroyed his eye. Last month a car broke his leg. Now he is out of the hospital and needs a place to stay. He had not eaten in a day, so I bought lunch for him. He too, was very glad to get a Bible and the Indian Symbols booklet. "I remember this," he said, and: "Without God I would not be alive!" He is waiting for the Good Samaritan Shelter to reopen! Pray that this will happen soon and that these folks stay safe, that they will read and understand the Scriptures and the literature they received. Thanks a lot for your help!

Please keep S.C. and Irene H. in your prayers, they were admitted to the hospital with C-19! At Pesach Irene had a miraculous recovery. She worked again, shuttling Covid patients from the quarantine location to the clinic, in full PPE, yet contracted the virus.
