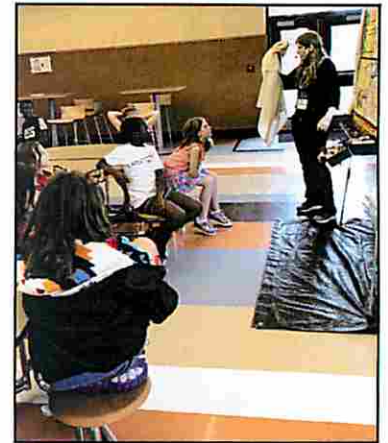

GOD HAS OPENED DOORS for New York State staff member, Erin Chervenak, to minister in various public schools. She joined a small team working in Rochester's Public School #17, which is located in a rough inner-city area where the children were often wild and inattentive. Sometimes Erin wondered if anything eternal was happening at this location, but she didn't give up, even when temporarily called away to minister at a different location. In time, it

became possible for her to go back and offer an extra pair of hands for the wild group. The team was glad to have her help, and so she went back with a painting of the story of Zacchaeus. The group was as unruly as ever; however, they suddenly became quiet during the Gospel presentation, their eyes fixed on the message! Afterward, carrying her equipment outside, she ran into one of the Bible Club kids who attended a number of years earlier, along with his brother and a couple of his friends. He remembered Erin; they had a good chat, and everyone took the tracts that were offered to them. It became evident that the Lord was drawing children to Himself in this difficult place. Erin was greatly encouraged that she persevered. God is blessing her obedience as she continues to walk through these open doors of opportunity.

ANATOLY AND YULIA KUSHNIRCHUK continue to be used of the Lord in Ukraine.
