### NORTH IDAHO COLLEGE

As last fall progressed, I continued working with Campus Alive in Christ (CAIC) a Christian club at North Idaho College (NIC). Each Monday we set up an information table with Bibles, books, and tracts, along with a riddle on the sketchboard. Praise the Lord for the students, faculty and staff that have kept this ministry going. Next fall marks 6 years I have been involved with CAIC. Each week there are students, Christian and non-Christian, stopping by to ask questions, debate, get materials, and 7-10 people show up for a student-led Bible study on Fridays at lunch time. ### A SHORT WORD ABOUT THE WORD ...

Do you have a biblical worldview? I recently read a short article on one of my newsfeeds that quoted a Barna poll that shows 7 out of 10 Americans consider themselves to be Christian, yet just 6% of those actually possess a biblical worldview. When I read that I did a quick Google search which showed 4-17% hold a biblical worldview. While many claim to be a Christian, few truly hold a biblical worldview. I observe this in people I meet while out doing ministry. A worldview is a personal collection of ideas and beliefs through which all of life is perceived and lived. A biblical worldview would be defined by 2 Timothy 3:15-16 and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, The truth of the Bible, faith in Jesus Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit, leads to salvation. A biblical worldview holds much deeper meaning than just holding to Judeo Christian practices and beliefs. Try as hard as you might to follow all the commands, you still fall short. Romans 3:23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, (Titus 3:3-7). A biblical worldview holds to what the Bible says about God, man, creation, sin, salvation and many other topics. If in your reading of Scripture you come acreoss something you don't understand or can't get your mind around, that means you probably need to study and pray more. Some of my best Bible study has come when I had to wrestle over a passage. I certainly didn't throw out the whole book because I didn't understand a word or a topic, I continued to study. Because of my biblical worldview I have a foundation to stand on and a standard greater than me to live by. Because of a biblical worldview I have a hope well beyond the suffering, chaotic world I see around me. Because of my biblical worldview, I get to have an influence, small by our standards it may be, on the world around me. Because of my biblical worldview I'm not dependent on temporal things for happiness and contentment. This can be a tough one to live; only in the power of the Holy Spirit does this happen. In closing, because of Christ and what He has done in me, I love and enjoy His word, and while I celebrate Hs resurrection, I look forward to the resurrection I have because of Him. (Romans 4:25, 1 Corinthians 15:54-58).
