## BALTIMORE OUTREACHES

Over the summer and into the fall, we have had various opportunities to bring the gospel to the city of Baltimore. We are working to partner with more churches in the area for ministry and future discipleship of those who respond. In the picture here Tasia and I shared the gospel with this couple. They claimed to be Christians, but with further questions found they believe that all paths lead to heaven. We emphasized the clear Biblical truth of John 14:6 and called them to trust in Christ alone for salvation and hope. This encounter was but one of many examples of people holding to a form of universalism. The gospel is needed so desperately, for a 2020 study has found that 62% of people in the U.S. believe God accepts the worship of all religions.
