Ministry on Malta: This island nation is mentioned by name in Acts 28:1. The Apostle Paul, on his way to Rome, was shipwrecked onto it \sim 61 AD. Our evangelism trip there was originally intended to happen in May of 2020, but was delayed until last November due to covid. I was praying and seeking someone, who also knew how to share the Gospel from the paint board, to serve with me on the trip. To my pleasant surprise, Brian, one of our OAC US leaders, and Tom, his father, were led to go. Our full team consisted of seven of us, all from the US, with only three of the seven having been to Malta previously.

Prior to arriving, we gathered that our ministry would be mostly to the Catholic Maltese, but that wasn't the case. I now understand that Malta's a popular holiday (*AKA vacation*) destination for Europeans. It's also a desired place to go to in order to find work for people from Asia and Africa. I was told that 100,000 of the half-million people on Malta were immigrants who were there to work. So, we actually ministered to **people from nearly 40 nations** with various belief systems! It was wonderful seeing the Holy Spirit use our team to His glory, especially Julia and Tom, who were probably the least-seasoned evangelists.

The trip was also difficult for me because I was on fumes for most of it. Good sleep was hard to find, on the planes and at our hotel, but the grace of the Lord sustained me. My fatigue likely contributed to me nearly losing my phone twice and my passport holder once. Losing, then finding my passport holder on a bus, only \sim 13 hours before our scheduled departure, was **a miracle**.

Overall, the ministry on Malta was great! We presented the glorious Gospel 17 times, to about 350 people, plus we witnessed **25 souls profess Jesus as Lord and Savior**, including two Muslim women and a Hindu man, who was studying to be a doctor! We left the ministry equipment in the hands of a couple from our team, who stayed a bit longer than us. They intended to train some Maltese saints and then give them the gear, with the hope that the Kingdom work would continue...

Quad Squad: On a slow, chilly night at Seal Beach pier, I saw four kids running around and playing. I jokingly called them *the quad squad* and prayed that they'd come my way, so I could share the Gospel with them. Not long after, my prayer was answered! Their crew consisted of **Levi**, two other boys and a girl. They enjoyed the riddle painting and were especially stoked when I showed them my three-ropes Gospel illusion. They gladly took DVDs about the life of the Lord Jesus with them.
