

We try to translate and when we don't do so well, their siblings help. That group went from three to seven kids. Russ and I trade the teaching responsibility week-to-week. For Easter, I used the Resurrection Eggs and the kids enjoyed the lesson. One regular boy came late, so I did a quick one-on-one teaching with him.





**Guys Get-away**: A friend and Brother-in-Christ, who I served in the Air Force with, now leads a ministry in Tennessee. It focuses on men who served in the military or as first-responders. He had been exhorting me to go on one of their weekend retreats for a while, so I decided to. It was great fellowshipping with new Brothers, plus experiencing another beautiful part of our country. I was also given an opportunity to teach an evangelism method to the guys.



**Interesting Timing:** At Redondo pier, a man mockingly yelled to warn people that we use our riddle painting to share Jesus with them. I reminded him that death would come for him one day and that where he was spiritually would matter very much then. Less than 30 minutes after that, a Christian man came over and asked to pray over us. I recalled the timing of the two contrasting situations with two brothers on our team that night and they were surprised and agreed that the timing was pretty significant.
