"It is such an encouragement to see how God works in every detail of our trip. Whether it's which kids come to which club, or which teen is placed where. It was truly incredible to see how each person was impacted by our time there. Seeing the looks on some of the kids faces as they listen so intently to the Gospel is something I will never forget." -Aria

"Before I went to Boston my spiritual health was in a really bad place. Months before, I was questioning whether I even believed in God anymore—I couldn't sit through a church service or have a normal conversation about spirituality without bitterness. I was in a better place before Boston, but it was still very new. I still had serious doubts and was extremely shallow with God. Because of this, I was so so so nervous to go to Boston and preach what I had just recently been denying/doubting. When I got there, I was doing better but nothing really happened until Thursday when I preached on Isaac and Abraham at the kids club. This was a monumental moment for me because I could feel the spirit speaking through me—the Spirit I wasn't even sure I had only weeks prior. I felt so passionate in that moment about God, and I wasn't sure I'd ever feel that again. I finally felt like a real believer again!! I'm so thankful that I got that lesson because I

SUMMER MINISTRY IS PRIMARILY FOCUSED on children's ministry with the local church. June started out with our own precious family in NH with our children and theirs for our annual consecration week. Diane and I are blessed. Seven 5-Day-Clubs were also conducted with seven churches. OAC missionaries Scott and Christine Domont, Brian Harmon, Erin Chervenak, Zane Dempsie, Ed Neimann, Jimmie and Becca Coates, and Chris and Bonnie McKinley brought some of their own children as well as other leaders and many teenagers to reach these neighborhoods and the city of Boston with the Gospel. What follows are some of their testimonies:

"The last evening of the outreach at the Merrimack Courts in Lawrence, we talked to a lot of people, one of these was Karilin. Karilin has five children, two of which went to the 5-Day-Club. She asked my daughter Charlene if she could pick up those two girls to go to church every other Sunday. The girls can't go every Sunday because one Sunday they stay with their mom and the other they stay with their dad. When my daughter agreed, Karilin gave Charlene her phone number. So every other Sunday, Charlene texts Karilin to ask if the girls are going and to tell her at what time she'll be at the apartment to pick them up. Since Karilin works, the grandmother will get them ready for church and Charlene picks them up ten minutes before the service starts. These two girls, Ashley (7) and Alaisha (3) wait anxiously for Sunday to come, Ashley has told Charlene that the Sundays she goes to church are the best days ever. They love going to church and when the service ends they greet everyone enthusiastically before Charlene takes them home to their grandmother." - Pastor Pablo

"It has been one of the best weeks of my life. It challenges your faith and your trust that God will tell you what to do. It helps you grow closer to God and your fellow believers. I got the opportunity to pray with Emi and she's now a believer."


