ear family in Christ, thank you so much for your prayers and support of our ministry! We couldn't do what we do without you! Here's a few highlights from the last few months of ministry. I hope they are a blessing to you.

We ran into Ami and some friends of his again! They had such awesome questions! "How can you believe in one God," they asked sincerely, "yet three at the same time?" We gave some examples, like how water can have the same substance yet appear as water, ice or vapor, even in the same location at the same time. We shared how in the beginning God said "Let US make man..." indicating a plurality or Tri-unity right from the very beginning, and how the Hebrew word "echad" for "one" also indicates a unity of plurality in the same sense as a husband and wife.

They asked how Jesus could be the Messiah if He broke the Sabbath. (Excellent question, as He did have a habit of healing people on the Sabbath). We shared how even the ancient Qumran Essenes believed that Messiah would be God incarnate, and therefore was the One who created the Sabbath. He taught that the Sabbath was made for man, and not man for the Sabbath and that it was lawful to do good on the Sabbath.

After we shared just a few of the 300 Messianic prophecies that Jesus fulfilled, they asked my favorite question of the day. "When Jesus came, he left many Messianic prophecies unfulfilled. Why should we believe He is the Messiah if He didn't fulfill all of the prophecies?" Everyone in the group agreed that this was a very good question!

I responded, "The one's who gave us the Dead Sea Scrolls, who believed that Messiah would be God incarnate, also believed in one Messiah with two comings, unlike the Pharisees and Sadducees who believed in two Messiahs. Archaeologists, Dead Sea Scrolls scholars, and even the Israel antiquities authority have come to the conclusion that Qumran was the school of John the Baptist. His group of Essenes claimed to be the original form of Judaism, and accused the Pharisees and Sadducees of apostasizing from the written word and getting into oral tradition. This is confirmed by the teachings of Jesus in the New Testament. So Jesus IS that one Messiah with two comings. He came the first time to take away our sins and to pay the debt of our iniquities through his shed blood on the cross, fulfilling the prophecies of the suffering servant. He will come again the second time to bring about the kingdom age. At that time He will fulfill the prophecies about Messiah the conquering King, Under his rule, His followers will experience Heaven on Earth like it was in the Garden of Eden before the fall."

Ami said, "That is a very interesting answer. I hadn't heard of the Essenes believing in one Messiah with two comings. From a Christian perspective, that would explain why you believe what you believe. I actually really am very interested in Christian theology...as an intellectual exercise of course...as I am Jewish. I have found that Christians I've spoken with have been very knowledgeable of the Bible. In fact, more knowledgeable of the Bible than my Jewish friends. I find this quite unfortunate, and think that we should have a much greater understanding of our own Scriptures."

I tried giving Ami and his friends a copy of the Gospel of John but he said they couldn't take it because it was a Sabbath. I encouraged them to pick up a copy of the Gospel of John when they got a chance and to read the teachings of Jesus for themselves. Please pray that the Lord would grab a hold of their hearts and that they would come to know their Messiah, Yeshua, the suffering Servant and soon coming King.





A highlight of our summer ministry is when we brought a team from our church to Chelsea for a week. It's so good to be with people who have a passion to reach the lost with the good news of Jesus Christ! We helped a local church with a daily kids club, and also shared the Gospel daily in downtown Boston, handing out tracts and initiating one-on-one conversations with locals, students, and tourists.
