The second testimony is the picture of the kids' club in Chelsea.

The third testimony came from Michael. He had just moved to Dedham the day I preached there, July 27. We met after the service, and he came up to me and said it was his first time in the church; he remembered being in a kids' club in Weymouth at Lake Street many years ago. Michael is now 35; he sent me a text later that day which said, "Thank you so very much. It was amazing seeing you again and I truly believe this is all God's plan. It's all starting to make sense to me and come back in full circle. I am honored and blessed to be able to be welcomed into such a beautiful community (church). I literally am new to everything and I will be questioning everything and not in a bad way. It's just I'm tired of living the way I do and I appreciate people like you. I truly do."

Three ministry teams from Michigan and one from Pennsylvania were all led by OAC evangelists. There were also teams from Methuen Massachusetts and Western New York. They all did adult ministry, also, during the week. I had the following conversation with a young Dunkin' Donuts employee. Alexander was on break and told me he was going to hell. When I asked him why he thought he was going to hell he said, "Because I deserve it." I told him he may be closer to heaven then most because everyone has to come to this conclusion first because it is what we all deserve. I shared the gospel with him, and he said, "I will take one of those tracts now" as he had rejected it when I first offered it to him. He had to leave for work so he thanked me and shook my hand.

Dear Praying Partners,

Jesus saw His disciples rebuke people for bringing their children to Him, and He was "greatly displeased" (Mark 10:13.14). Children's ministry occupies much of our time in the open air during the summer. The opportunities for children to hear the gospel are becoming more limited unless they venture into a Bible-believing church or the same church ventures out to them. Eight 5-day clubs were conducted by churches "going out" to their neighborhoods assisted by many ministry teams from other churches with their teens and adults. The following is a testimony of a teen when she heard the gospel as a child and now, as a 14-year-old, is counselled by Torri, a teen on one of the Michigan teams who shared this story: "Before the message we were talking and she said that she had attended a kids club back in 2019 and she enjoyed it, so when she heard we were there she wanted to come and see if it was as fun as she remembered. Then after the message she told me it was hard for her not to cry during the message because it touched her. Then I went through the counseling booklet with her and she started crying while I was talking to her and answering her questions. She told me she wanted to get her life back on track. We finished the booklet and she asked me if I knew where I was going when I die. I was able to share my testimony with her and she said that related to some of it, it was a really sweet time. She then asked me if we could pray because she wanted to go to heaven and wanted to follow the Lord. So I asked her to pray and she was apprehensive at first and said that she wasn't good at it. So I just told her to pray from her heart and just talk to God like He was sitting next to her. She prayed out loud so I got to hear her. I can't quite remember the prayer but it was something like: dear God, I'm sorry for everything I have done to sin against you, I am so sorry but I know there's nothing I can do to make up for it, only Jesus can. I love you and I need you. Please come into my life and fix me, make me brand new, and help me do what you want me to do. Thank you for sending your Son to die for my sins so that I can be with you in heaven, because I know that is the only way I can be with you. Please come into my life and have me do what you want me to do, be my Lord and my best friend, love you, Amen. She stopped crying and then told me she didn't have a Bible, so we found her one and she started crying again. She said no one has ever given such a thoughtful gift before. I then connected her with some people from the church."

The following testimonies are from parents in their 30s who heard the gospel in one of our "Kids Clubs" and now want their children to hear the same message. These three testimonies all took place during the same week that we ministered with Calvary Baptist in Dedham and Charles River Church in Roslindale.

The dad (with all the tattoos, see picture of Hayden and his dad talking to me) came up to the van all excited and with a huge grin. His son (Hayden) was attending the 5-day Kids' Club. The dad was 31 years old and told us that he remembers attending these clubs when he saw me in the van. You could tell he had such a happy memory of those times.
